

## **MISSION STORY**



Corpus Christi Feast June 19



A missionary Nun, Betsy Devasia, working in Guwahati,

Assam, was conferred with 11th International Human Rights Award for her contribution to women development in the region by Delhi-based International Human Rights Council on 10 December 2021 at the India Islamic Centre Auditorium, New Delhi. Sister Betsy Devasia, born on 1 July 1947 in Kerala's Kottayam district, has been working in Northeast India for the last 30 years.

"I am not sure if I deserve this honour", said the septuagenarian Holy Cross Nun. "Serving the people of Northeast India in various roles since 1988 and as Director of Women Development Centre (WDC), Guwahati, since 2008, has been the most rewarding experience of my life. That is an award in itself".

The WDC, established in the year 2000 as a millennium gift to the women in Northeast India by Archbishop Emeritus Thomas Menamparampil, has been catering to the women from rural areas of the region with slew of initiatives to empower them to take their lives forward.

One of the major activities of WDC is educating school dropped out tribal girls to complete their schooling through National Open School. Started with five students in 2005, more than 500 tribal girls from Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Manipur, Nagaland, Tripura, Mizoram and Assam have completed their secondary education. The current batch has 65 students.

Accepting the award, Sister Devasia said, "My award is to be able to see the lives of these underprivileged children change completely. The underconfident girls who through our educational portals are never the same. They leave our campus with confidence and courage to face the world to make positive contribution to make it a better place to live in".

"That these girls are well placed in life is my award" - Sister Devasia.



### **COMMUNIO ASST DIRECTOR...**

#### Fr. G Vignan Das

I come from Vijayawada in Andhra Pradesh, India. We have been Roman Catholics for the past three generations. At home I have my mother, elder sister and a younger brother. My father, Mr. Devasahayam, passed away in 2015 – he was a righteous man, who preferred living his Christian faith by helping people – he was a Trade Union leader. My mother Mrs. Jhansi Rani is a pious woman, who even though had a protestant upbringing, after marriage started living the Catholic faith. She taught us the importance of personal prayer and Holy Eucharist





#### **My Vocation Story**

My mother gave birth to first male child in 1978-79 and he died immediately after birth, after that God blessed my parents with girl child, my elder sister. Later God heard prayers of my parents and I was born (30 Oct 1982) and my dad gave the name Vignan Das, as he decided for his first born male child. As first born male child of my parents died immediately after birth, when I was born my grandmother (mother's mother – Kandru Karunamma) took me to church and offered / presented me to God according to the tradition / custom of that village (Nidamarru 20 Kms from Vijayawada) and after presenting me to God; she bought me back by paying some money to the church and gave to my parents. (Like Example: Luke 2:22-24, Ex 13:2.12, 1 Sam 1:24-28, Num 3:47-48 etc.). I feel, this presentation of mine to God turned to be lifelong commitment to God through Church, as Priest.

#### How can a young person support Communio?

Young people have lot of energy, they are fully loaded with creativity, if they are convinced of their mission, they can support the mission of the Church, which we can not even imagine. Young people can reach to the places & situations where clergy and religious can't reach. They can communicate better to the world in the language, terminology which people can easily convinced. Few possibilities I foresee for a young person to support Communio is by volunteering himself/herself by sharing their talents, time and also taking a commitment for physical presence by taking short/long term missions to spread the kingdom of God in this country, mostly importantly by praying for missions, following example of St. Theresa of Liseux, Patroness of Missionaries, by doing small things with great love.
