First Sunday of Advent

"Love one another as I have loved you" (John 13:34)

"The Conference of Catholic Bishops of India (CCBI), after the launch of the National Pastoral Plan in 2013, conceived the idea at different stages, and 'Communio' saw its light in 2017, at the XXIX Plenary Assembly held in Bhopal.

The celebration of the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy (8 Dec 2015 to 20 Nov 2016) announced by our Holy Father Pope Francis. and the canonization of Mother Teresa of Kolkata, a model of mercy and compassion, propelled the launch.

This historical decision to begin 'Communio' to help poor dioceses and religious congregations working in the missions was taken when the Executive Committee members of the CCBI gathered at St. John's National Academy of Health Sciences, Bangalore, on 20 September 2016.

Khawzawl | Diocese of Aizawl, Mizoram



The present Church is located near Anchal, Kollam in Kollam District. The Pastoral Care of the mission is entrusted with the Capuchin Friars. The present church is in a dilapidated condition. The parish consists of 11 catholic families. However, many non-Catholics and non-Christians frequent the Church services like Kristu Bhakatas. Moreover, the people around the Church are also from the marginalized section of the society and we have a moral obligation to help them. The most important help that we can render is to provide facilities for the Children and youth to have a good atmosphere to study.


Today Communio supports 40 ongoing projects across India and is reaching about 12,000 priests and religious in the church through the one minute videos based on the Catholic faith





POPE FRANCIS INSTALLS ABP. FILIPE NERI AND ABP. ANTHONY POOLA AS CARDINALS

Cardinal Filipe Neri António Sebastião do Rosário Ferrão, born on 20th January 1953, in Aldona, Goa, was ordained priest on 28th October 1979. Appointed Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Goa and Daman at the age of 40 by Pope John Paul II on 20th December, 1993, he received the Episcopal Ordination on the 10th of April, 1994. On 12th December, 2003,



he was appointed the Archbishop of Goa and Daman and Patriarch "ad honorem" of the East Indies and installed on the 21st of March, 2004. He was elected as the President of the Conference of Catholic Bishops of India, at its 31st Plenary Assembly, held in 2019 in Chennai. He had previously served both the CCBI and the CBCI as Vice-President. As the President of the CCBI, he is also a member of the Central Committee of the Federation of Asian Bishops' Conferences (FABC) having been the Chairman of the FABC Office of Education and Faith Formation (OEFF). He is fluent in Konkani, English, Portuguese, Italian, French and German.



Cardinal Anthony Poola, born on 15th November, 1961, at Chindhukur, Andhra Pradesh joined the minor seminary in Kurnool and subsequently studied at St. Peter's Pontifical Major Seminary, Bangalore. He was ordained priest on 20th February, 1992. At the age of 46, he was appointed Bishop of Kurnool on 8th February, 2008 having received Episcopal Ordination on 19th April 2008. On 19th November, 2020, at the age of 59, he was appointed as the Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Hyderabad, being installed as its fifth Archbishop on 3rd January, 2021.

He was the Chairman for the Youth Commission of the Telugu Regional Bishops' Council, Chairman for Scheduled Castes/Backward Classes Commission, Chairman of the Andhra Pradesh Social Service Society, Secretary General and Treasurer of the Telugu Regional Bishops' Council, Chairman of the Sikh Village Campus, Secretariat for TCBC Priests Community and Chairman of the Jeevan in-state Printing Press.
