








COMMUNIO A CALL FOR MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

THE IDEA

The idea of Communio was propelled by the announcement of the celebration of the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy in 2015 by the Holy Father, Pope Francis.

ESTABLISH COMMUNIO

The historical decision to establish 'Communio' was made during the gathering of the Executive Committee members of the CCBI at St. John's National Academy of Health Sciences, Bangalore, on September 20, 2016. St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta was chosen as the Patron Saint of Communio.

Communio finally saw its light in 2017, at the XXIX Plenary Assembly that was held in Bhopal.





COMMUNIO SUNDAY

The first ever Communio Sunday was then observed at national level on December 2, 2018, and since then it has continued to be celebrated every year on the first Sunday of Advent.

FIFTY-FIVE DIOCESES

Fifty-five dioceses have appointed diocesan directors for Communio in 2019. The Communio Sunday circular was translated in Hindi and vernacular languages. The one-minute promo video for Communio was launched.

Despite the pandemic, the faithful generously contributed around 50 lakhs to Communio to support our missionaries in rural areas.





JOURNEY OF COMMUNIO

DIGITAL EVANGELISATION

Communio started spreading its wings of evangelisation through various digital platforms.

One-minute faith-based and feast-day videos in English and in regional languages were launched.

The first Projects Selection Committee (PSC) of Communio was held on Monday, December 20, 2021, Bangalore. 44 project applications were received in 2021 from 33 dioceses and 2 religious congregations. The PSC approved 26 projects.

The Communio website (www.communio.in) was launched on December 16, 2021



The first Communio e-newsletter was published in December 2021.





THE ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR

The Associate Director for Communio was appointed in July 2022.

Communio was registered as two societies in Delhi in September 2022. The Communio Pastoral Society (Pastoral) and the Aviral Outreach Society (Charitable).

The second Project Selection Committee (PSC) of Communio was held on September 19, 2022. 18 project applications were received in 2022 from 11 dioceses, 2 religious congregations, and 4 national and regional commissions. PSC approved 16 projects.



PROJECT SELECTION COMMITTEE

The third Projects Selection Committee (PSC) meeting of Communio was held on May 6, 2023, and the fourth Projects Selection Committee (PSC) meeting of Communio was held on September 20, 2023, at St. John's National Academy of Health Sciences, Bangalore. Around 75 projects were approved; for the first time, a few projects were also approved through the Aviral Outreach Society.

Communio Pastoral Society got renewed for the 12A Certificate, and Aviral Outreach Society got renewed for the 80G Certificate.

COMMUNIO VOLUNTEERSHIP PROGRAMME


The culminating event included a solemn Holy Mass presided over by Cardinal Ferrão, during which 30 young leaders from diverse ten regions pledged their commitment to serve as lay missionaries in rural India.

Graced with certificates bestowed by the Cardinal himself, these individuals symbolized a burgeoning movement of dedicated volunteers poised to make a tangible difference in their communities.

Participants were enriched during the programme in knowledge through session topics related to Church, mission, volunteering and role and use of media in the digital eta. The programme was jointly organised by Communio and CCBI Youth Commission.

In collaboration with the Youth Commission, Communio will organize two to three programmes annually. Notably, the programme's distinctiveness lies in its one-month missionary exposure in rural India.

RENOVATION OF PARISH HALL AT BAGHADAFA

Diocese: Balasore | Location: Odisha

ommunio assisted the parishioners of the Holy Rosary Catholic Mission at Baghadafa in Mayurbhanj District, in the Diocese of Balasore, Orissa, with the renovation of their multipurpose hall. This mission is predominantly a 'Ho' tribal mission, which comprises 28 villages in a radius of 46 km. Baghadafa Mission started in 2010 and is flourishing well.

A village chapel was put up with the sole contribution of the tribal converts, and later the region was declared a parish. Now there is a priest residing at this chapel to cater to the pastoral and spiritual needs of the people.



COMMUNITY BUILDING THROUGH FAITH FORMATION

Diocese: Baruipur | Location: West Bengal

Community Building through Faith Formation

The target of the project is to celebrate the Great Jubilee of Christ's Paschal Mystery in the year 2033, fulfilling his great command of proclaiming the good news. It is to help the people in deepening and maturing their faith; building up and strengthening the Christian communities of the believers; bringing about renewal in the families; and creating an atmosphere of love, peace, and unity in the communities.







CONSTRUCTION OF A VILLAGE CHAPEL AT GANDABIL

Diocese: Bongaigaon | Location: Assam

The project is to construct a village chapel at Birjhora Tea Garden at St. Joseph's Parish in the Diocese of Bongaigaon. There are eight Catholic communities (villages) under St. Joseph's parish area with 187 families. Birjhora Tea Garden is far away from the parish centre, and it is not easy for all the people to come to the parish centre. Once a month, the priest visits the village to celebrate the Holy Eucharist.





CONSTRUCTION OF A TEMPLE SHAPED CHURCH GANDHINAGAR

Archdiocese: Gandhinagar | Location: Gujarat

The Archdiocese of Gandhinagar is a new and missionary archdiocese. Pethapur in Gandhinagar is the location of the church and has the Archbishop House, Apostolic School, Pastoral Centre, and Social Work Centre. People from all walks of life come to this centre. This church will be helpful for all communities belonging to different faiths.



FAMILY RENEWAL PROGRAMME IN HAZARIBAGH

Diocese: Hazaribagh | Location: Jharkhand

Most are very poor, and they live their lives with their daily earnings. As the faithful are very far away from the parish and live in remote areas, they are unable to come to the parish for mass and other programmes regularly. So, their faith level is very poor. So, family visits, counselling, seminars, retreats, gatherings, home missions, etc. will help them to be better faithful with good family bonds. They need timely support and care.





ANIMATION PROGRAMME FOR A SYNODAL CHURCH

Diocese: Hazaribagh | Location: Jharkhand

The project is aimed at building up a Synodal Church through a process of renewal by deepening and strengthening the faith of the people. Therefore, a series of activities are organized to build up a healthy Local Church and society by instilling gospel values in the young, cultivating interest in spiritual matters and sacraments, encouraging people's participation, and providing lay pastoral leadership.



RENOVATION OF LOUPHOUCHUM CHURCH

Archdiocese: Imphal | Location: Manipur

The Louphouchum is one of the mission centres which is bifurcated from sacred heart parish Yaripok in 2018. The catholic community of Loupouchum is going to celebrate the silver Jubilee of their acceptance of faith by 2025.







RENOVATION OF A CHURCH HALL

Diocese: Jamshedpur | Location: Jharkhand

The objectives of the project are to have a decent place of worship for the Catholic community. To have a larger space so that when Catholics from far-away villages come, there is sufficient space to accommodate them and to have a symbol of Christian existence in the locality.







CONSTRUCTION OF VILLAGE CHAPEL AT GONDEKON

Diocese: Jashpur | Location: Chhattisgarh

Adhwa Parish is located in the north of the Diocese of Jashpur in Chhattisgarh state, 34 km away from the district of Jashpur. This place is situated on the border of Jharkhand. There are 23 villages in this parish. The mountainous region of Madhwa was part of Ambakona parish. The faithful had to cover a long distance through thick forest on foot to attend holy mass and receive the sacraments. The project is aimed at providing the faithful with a convenient place for prayer, Holy Mass, prayer services, and catechism.







FORMATION PROGRAMME FOR LAY SECULAR SISTERS

Diocese: Jhabua | Location: Madhya Pradesh

The Lay Women Missionaries of Don Bosco were established in 1979. The members of this secular institute are called Behenjis. The prime goal of these missionaries is to spread the gospel while living a simple life in the villages in a community of two. After a short period of training in religious life and the Bible, they make the promises of poverty, chastity, and obedience. Then they are sent to dioceses, where they will stay and work in the villages two by two. After six years of the first commitment, they take the final commitment and become permanent members of the community.



CONSTRUCTION OF A CHURCH AT UMMULONG

Diocese: Jowai | Location: Meghalaya

mmulong parish started in 1999 and is 14 kilometers from Jowai, the headquarter of the district. As most of the people in Ummulong and its neighbouring villages are illiterate and poor, the faithful use to find it difficult to attend church services during the rainy season and the winter season. The old church was not able to accommodate more than 250 people inside the church. So, with the partial aid of Communio this beautiful church was constructed as the Catholic population is increasing from time to time at this parish.







ESTABLISHMENT OF AUDIO-VISUAL STUDIO IN KHUNTI

Diocese: Khunti | Location: Jharkhand

The project aimed at establishing a small media production studio in the pastoral centre of Khunti Diocese. This studio will be used for the production of catechetical videos for faith formation, YouTube videos of major eucharistic celebrations and major events of the diocese, the composition of hymns, especially in Mundari, and many other needs of the diocese according to the need of time.






CONSTRUCTION OF A VILLAGE CHURCH AT

DURALIANG

Diocese: Miao | Location: Arunachal Pradesh

The people of Duraliang belong to the Mishmi tribe. Agriculture is their main occupation. In this village, there are 70 Catholic families, initially a church was made of bamboo walls and covered with tin sheets. But it was not able to yield long for the weather and wear and tear. As this mission station is active and dynamic with many activities and animation programs for children, youth, women and the elderly, Communio granted partial aid to built a new church to give a space for faithful for more participation in liturgy and other faith formation activities.





RENOVATION OF PRESBYTERY AT ALMA MISSION

Archdiocese: Nagpur | Location: Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh

This project aims at the renovation of the roof of the parish house at Amla Mission of the Archdiocese of Nagpur. There are water leakages on the roof of this building. So, there is an urgent need to repair the roof and stop the greater damage to the building. All the meetings and parish programmes are held in a small hall, which is part of the parish house. Renovation of the presbytery is beneficial to not only the priests but also the faithful of this Amla mission.





MOTORCYCLE FOR PASTORAL WORK ANDAMAN

Diocese : Port Blair | Location : Andaman and Nicobar Islands

The motorcycles requested are for the parishes of Our Lady of Fatima Parish, Ram Nagar, North Andaman, and St. Joseph Parish in Campbell Bay, Great Nicobar. Ram Nagar is one of the Parishes in North Andaman, situated about 340 km from Port Blair. The parish has 143 families. The parish consists of three substations. Campbell Bay is the southernmost parish of the diocese, situated in the Great Nicobar Islands. The distance between Port Blair and Great Nicobar is about 500 km. The parish has 324 families. It has six sub-stations.

The parish fathers need to move within the parish to celebrate the Holy Masses in sub-stations, conduct BEC meetings in all villages, visit families, and provide other spiritual needs to the people. A simple two-wheeler is necessary for the fathers to travel around the parish.





ROOFING WORKS OF 2 VILLAGE CHAPELS IN PORT BLAIR

Diocese : Port Blair | Location : Andaman and Nicobar Islands

Shoalbay is one of the sub-stations of St. Francis Xavier Church, Wimberlygunj parish, in the South Andaman District. The village has 34 Catholic families. The Wimberlygunj parish has 10 sub-stations, besides the Parish Church at Wimberlygunj. Daily Masses are conducted in Wimberlygunj, and the weekly Holy Mass is celebrated in the sub-stations. Besides this, the people are further organized in small Christian communities.

Kaulsalyanagar is one of the sub-stations of St. Francis Xavier Church, Rangat parish, in the middle Andamans. The sub-station has 32 Catholic families. Rangat parish has 14 village chapels, besides the parish church at Rangat. Daily Masses are conducted in Rangat, and bi-monthly Holy Mass is celebrated in the sub-stations.



PURCHASES OF MOTOR VEHICLES FOR PASTORAL WORKS

Archdiocese: Ranchi | Location: Jharkhand

This project is aimed at evangelization and pastoral care in the archdiocese of Ranchi. To be available for the faithful by visiting the sick, not only the Catholic people, but also other needy people in the parish. It requires priests to be on wheels for quite some time. Four new priests of the Ranchi Archdiocese are not capable of purchasing a motorbike of their own. Making available to them a motorbike will help them tremendously in their pastoral work.



INSTALLATION OF SOLAR LIGHT SYSTEMS IN RENGARIH AND DANFTOLI

Diocese: Simdega | Location: Jharkhand

St. Anthony Apostolic School, Rengarih, was started on the campus of a secondary high school with a few rooms in the old building in 1994. Around 125 students each year lived in that house until 2011. They could build the proper and spacious building only in 2012, and at present, there are 90 students aspiring for priesthood and attending regular classes in the same secondary high school. There are two priests and two regents to look after them. The supply of electricity is very poor. Therefore, they need to install the solar system for light and water supply.



CONSTRUCTION OF CHURCH IN NELLIPATHY

Diocese: Sultanpet | Location: Kerala

Nellipathy is a hilly area in Attapady. The Catholics are spread out in and around the parish house; they are living among the Hindus and Muslims, spread out in about 30 km of distance; they are daily coolies in the rubber estate. It is a long-time desire and need of the people to have a church for the people instead of a small hall. It is also their wish that if their Catholic parish is active there, many Catholics who left for other denominations will also come back.



PASTORAL ANIMATION PROGRAMME IN TRICHY

Diocese: Tiruchirappalli | Location: Tamil Nadu

The diocese of Tiruchirappalli has 5 vicariates, i.e., 73 parishes, which have 296 rural substations. Since they have only three trained catechists in their diocese, the rural Catholics become poorer at practicing their Catholic faith. Therefore, they wanted to make a faith formation program in the whole diocese. The project is all about faith education and faith formation for the faithful at various levels. It involves the training of the animators and, subsequently, the animators educating the common people in all five vicariates.

RENOVATION OF PARISH CHURCH AT KHAWZAL

Diocese: Aizawl | Location: Mizoram

St. John the Apostle Parish, Khawzawl, is geographically situated under Khawzawl District in the State of Mizoram. The parish was established by the Holy Cross Fathers in 1998. Since then, a small hut for worship has been erected. St. John the Apostle Parish, Khawzawl, has now reached the milestone of its 25 years of existence. The population increased on a large scale. This parish consists of 11 substations or villages. The area is fertile for sowing the seed of faith.







RENOVATION OF A CHAPEL IN YEDDALADINNI

Diocese: Bellary | Location: Karnataka

In the past, at this centre, an old church was constructed with mud and bricks with Kadapa stone, and a mud roof was erected. Now that the old church is in a dilapidated condition, the people though they are eager, they are unable to support this project fully. The government of Karnataka, through its Minority Development Council, is assured of their grant to some extent. The church building will enable the people to participate in the Holy Eucharist and other liturgical celebrations more fervently.





YOUTH ANIMATION IN KARNATAKA REGION

Commission: Youth | Region: Karnataka

The Karnataka Regional Catholic Bishops' Council's Youth Commission organizes many youth-oriented programmes in Karnataka. The one such mega programme is 'Karnataka Regional Youth Convention Yuvajanotsava' which is organized once every two years. The Youth Commission has organized the Yuvajanotsava-2022 from October 22–25, 2022, at Christ School Auditorium, Bangalore. Around 3000 youth from 14 dioceses in Karnataka participated in this regional convention. This programme is aimed at bringing Christ-oriented life to young people and making them missionary disciples in their own dioceses.



RENOVATION OF A CHURCH AT NEW VONGTI

Diocese: Kohima | Location: Nagaland

ew Vongti village comes under St. Paul's Parish, Pungro, in the district of Kiphire. New Vongti village is about twenty years old, with 33 households and about 140 people, most of whom are Catholics. This community was expelled from the Vongti village since they became Catholics. They had to leave their old village and establish this new village. It is 54 kilometers away from Kiphire, the district headquarters. It is one of the remotest villages in Nagaland. The Catholic Community, though small, is a strong and active community.











RENOVATION OF A CHURCH AT **ERAM**

Diocese: Punalur | Region: Kerala

St. Mary's Church in Eram is a mission station and hails from the marginalized section of society. This project aims to construct a new church with a plinth area of 920 square feet along with a study hall, to create a prayerful atmosphere for liturgy, to deepen faith formation through catechism classes and liturgical celebrations, and to bring up the children and youth and facilitate their study. Most of the children in and around the church do not have proper facilities at home.



CONSTRUCTION OF A CHURCH AT BIJAPUR

Diocese: Rayagada | Location: Odisha

Bijapur is a very poor and interior parish that was established on August 15, 2021, and is bifurcated from Marattiguda parish. There are about 450 Catholic families and around 3150 Catholics in the area. The Catholics are mainly Adivasi and Dalits. They are economically and socially backward. They were being evangelized by the Vincentian missionaries of Madrid Province. The project is aimed at constructing a parish church for the faithful of Bijapur parish.





MOTOR BIKES FOR PASTORAL WORKS IN MAJHIPALI

Diocese: Sambalpur | Region: Odisha

The vision of Khristo Jyoti Mohavidyaloyo envisages a contextualized theological formation, integrating the spiritual (Bhakti), intellectual (Jnana), and practical (Karma) aspects into holistic life and pastoral preparedness. The resident staff members have to be role models in the area of pastoral work for the seminarians. The seminarians are bound to be inspired when they see their formators fully involved in pastoral work on the weekends. In order to effectively animate, they need at least three new motorbikes.



RENOVATION OF STAFF QUARTERS AT REGIONAL THEOLOGATE

Diocese: Sambalpur | Location: Odisha

The staff quarters for the resident staff members of Khristo Jyoti Mohavidyaloyo were built in 1986. It was necessary to replace the existing asbestos sheets on the roof with the plastic quote sheets. This project is aimed at improving the infrastructural facilities on the seminary campus so that seminarians will have better facilities and the seminary staff will have a decent place to stay.







PURCHASE OF MOTORBIKES FOR PASTORAL WORKS

Diocese: Gulbarga | Location: Karnataka

Gulbarga is a mission diocese with great potential for mission work. The diocese has succeeded in starting 14 new missions in the past 18 years of its existence. All missionaries work together as a team; the missionary spirit is visible in their work and lifestyle. The priest needs to travel to villages from the mission centre every week to celebrate the Holy Eucharist, other sacraments, and to teach catechism. This alone will sustain the faith of the people and help them to grow in faith. The priests need conveyance to travel to missions.

RENOVATION OF A VILLAGE CHAPEL AT BEMARLA

Diocese: Gumla | Location: Jharkhand

hatom is a small village in Bishunpur block in Gumla District of State. It is located 42 kilometers to the north from the district headquarters of Gumla. The total population is 739, and the number of houses is 150. A village chapel was built in 1975 at Chatom, Bimarla parish, but it was a muddy one. People have tried to construct a new village chapel, but due to financial problems, they are not able to complete it, and there is an urgent need to have a new chapel.





ANIMATION PROGRAMME IN HAZARIBAGH

Diocese: Hazaribagh | Location: Jharkhand

The purpose of the project is to strengthen the faith life of the community, which is an integral part of our pastoral work. Therefore, the following programmes are planned for the pastoral formation of the community and the building up of the Church: 1. Equipping catechists, catechism teachers, lay leaders, and families through seminars and trainings. 2. Instilling family values through various family renewal programmes. 3. Teaching elementary catechism, importance of sacraments, and basic understanding of the Bible, and sensitizing the parish family on the synod by explaining synodality as walking together with the family along the path to heaven accompanied by the parish family.

FAMILY RENEWAL PROGRAMME HAZARIBAG

Diocese: Hazaribagh | Location: Jharkhand

azaribagh diocese has a family counselling centre with the family apostolate team led by Holy Family sisters. This team is entrusted with the Family Commission of the Diocese. The team visits the families regularly, counsels the couples, youth, and children, arranges home missions in the remote areas, and conducts retreats, seminars, and renewal programs for the different groups like parents, families, couples, youth, children, elderly parents, widows, and widowers.









RENOVATION OF A CHURCH AT TAKLINGTAK

Diocese: Itanagar | Location: Arunachal Pradesh

Takingtak mission station is located in Monigong parish under Itanagar diocese; it is one of the remotest and most inaccessible places in the ranges of the Himalayas on the border with China. The Franciscans from OFM (Cap) are giving excellent pastoral service in this remote area. This project is proposed to transform the old bamboo-built chapel into a concrete wall-tin roof chapel, which can accommodate more faithful liturgical services and basic amenities.



RENOVATION OF CHAPEL AT CHOTI DHAMNI

Diocese: Jhabua | Location: Madhya Pradesh

Choti Dhamni is a substation of Thandla Catholic Church. Since 1970, this has been a substation of Thandla parish. In the year 2015, after the construction of a new school building, a residential priest is appointed from the diocese to take care of the pastoral needs of the Catholic community as well as look after the primary school. The existing building at Choti Dhamni is in dilapidated condition. It is necessary to build a chapel for the mass and Sunday catechism.





t. Joseph Educational and Charitable Trust is a social wing of the Congregation of Sisters of St. Joseph of Saint-Marc, known as SJSM, which originated in France in Saint-Marc, Alsace, in 1845. St. Joseph Convent is situated at K. Lhangnom, 20 km away from Imphal. SJSM Sisters are involved in pastoral, social, and teaching ministry in collaboration with the archdiocese of Imphal. Ten apostolic students are accommodated in the convent. educational facilities are provided, and 4 are supported for their education being in their family due to difficulty in changing schools. These children are from 7th to 10th grade, and they study at a Catholic school that is 4 km away from the convent.

Archdiocese: Imphal | Location: Manipur

RENOVATION OF ORIENTATION SEMINARY, GHOLENG

Diocese: Jashpur | Location: Chhattisgarh

St. Xavier's Orientation Seminary, Gholeng, was constructed in 1988. Since the seminary was built in 1988, the windows and doors are in very bad shape and broken. They give entry to unwanted elements and the seminarians experience danger. Apart from this, it is a fully functioning institute that meets the objectives of the candidates aspiring to be future priests. All students are required to learn harmonious community living so that they will be able to work with other people as a team.





PURCHASE OF A TWO-WHEELER FOR KOTBA MISSION

Diocese: Jashpur | Location: Chhattisgarh

otba parish is situated in a very rural setting. It is 20 km north-west of Bhelwa and 11 km south of Bagbahar. The Congregation, Servants of Mary, promptly responded to the invitation of the bishop to collaborate in the pastoral activities of the parish and in the English Medium School. Sisters are coming for the first time and opening a new community at Kotba, which is a new parish, and so many faithful are newly baptized. In such a given situation, faith formation is a big task. Continuously visiting the family and being in touch with the students and youth will make them strong in their faith.



MISSIONARY FORMATION THROUGH DANCE IN MEERUT

Diocese: Meerut | Location: Uttar Pradesh

During the summer holidays, Meerut Diocese has planned out a short course of Bharatnatyam classical dance for the girls to showcase their talent. This course enables them to develop more discipline, patience, and self-confidence. Along with the dance course, the diocese also provides them with bible study, moral values, vocal music, and catechism classes for boosting their personalities, with a vision to transform them into missionary disciples.

REPAIR AND RENOVATION OF A CONVENT IN DAVANGERE

Diocese: Shimoga | Location: Karnataka

Congregation : Sisters Adorers at Navajyothi Nilaya

This project is to reconstruct the existing compound wall, which was very low, in a dilapidated condition, and had a lot of disturbances from trespassers who were a threat to safety and the security of the inmates. Ordinary people show a keen interest in owning and studying the sacred scripture. The cost of the Bible is a bit high. So ordinary people cannot afford to pay. This project enables every family to own a Bible. It encourages Christian families to deepen their spiritual lives based on the word of God, to bring the Bible to the church, and to participate actively in the liturgical celebrations.

Diocese: Bellary | Location: Karnataka


Congregation: Poor clares adoration monastery, 'La verna'

a Verna Adoration Monastery was established at T.B. Dam, Hospet Taluk, Vijayanagar District of Karnataka on 24 March 2001 at the request of Bishop Joseph D'Silva, the then Bishop of Bellary to be the spiritual power house for the faithful of the diocese of Bellary.

The monastery building was constructed about 23 years back, and is now leaking due to wear and tear, weather conditions etc. Inside the monastery, which is built with very simple materials they have very small cells for each sister.

An unexpected wall collapse within the cloister has also added to their concern. As they solely depend in the providence of God, through the generosity of the people who visit the monastery they applied this project of renovation of monastery building.







REPAIR AND RENOVATION OF ST. TERESA CHURCH, SINDRI

Diocese: Jamshedpur | Location: Jharkhand

St. Teresa's Church, Sindri was built in the year 1957. It is a small parish consists of 35 Catholic families. Though they are economically weak but rich in faith. The Church building is nearly 65 years old. Its roof is constructed by the wooden planks and asbestos sheets. Now they are rotten and broken resulting leakage in multiple places. It has also damaged the false ceiling and painting of the walls. Thus, it required immediate repair.

The tribal people are big in number. Their faith is slowly growing and becoming stronger. The church is making its presences through frequent family visits, masses, counselling and providing help in sickness.

PURCHASE OF NEW MOTORCYCLE FOR PASTORAL WORK

Diocese: Jamshedpur | Location: Jharkhand

From the Diocesan headquarter the parish is situated 114kms far inside the jungles. The faithful are spread far-flung areas, having distance is 40 kms away from the parish dwelling in hills, valleys and thick jungles. It is difficult for the priest to go and do the mission due to the far distance of the different villages to attend sick calls and administer the sacraments, to conduct BCC & SCC prayer in the villages. Therefore, they requested Communio to provide a Motor-cycle for the pastoral needs of the parish.

To have effective pastoral ministry among the villagers by conducting prayer meetings (BCC & SCC etc.) and Catechism classes for children and catechumens. Make them have common resolutions which suits their areas environmentally, socially, culturally to build church of Christ. The project will help to increase communication with faithful, build human closeness resulting in love and care. Learn the meaning of fellowship, discipleship broadening ministry of Christ.





YOUTH ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

Diocese: Khandwa | Location: Madhya Pradesh

handwa diocese has 37 parishes and 782 registered youth and 700 cruzveer members. The Project visualized conducting a 5 days faith formation and 3 days career guidance at the deanery level. These programs provided them with a platform to receive pastoral care and support.

RENOVATION OF THE PRESBYTERY AT GARRATOLA

Archdiocese: Nagpur | Location: Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh

Garratola Mission is one of the farthest Mission Stations of Nagpur Archdiocese. This place is situated 250 kilometres away from the Archdiocesan Headquarter. This Mission caters to the needs of 250 catholic families spread over an arear of 50 kilometres. There are two priests residing in this presbytery catering to the pastoral needs of the people. This Mission Station is supported by the archdiocese, especially for the maintenance of the priests. This project is to provide a modest accommodation for the resident priests and the guests who come for pastoral work.





ROOFING OF THE CHAPEL AT HABDIPUR, FERRARGUNJ PARISH

Diocese : Port Blair | Location : Andaman and Nicobar Islands

abdipur is one of the Sub-stations of St. Joseph Church, Ferragunj, South Andaman. The village has 78 catholic families. The faithful built a church in the year 1985 and that Church was in a dilapidated condition. This project aims to have a decent and permanent village chapel to be used for celebrating the Holy Mass, Conduct BEC Meetings, Conduct catechism classes. village meetings, etc. Being placed within the graveyard area, the chapel will be used to celebrate burial masses.

REPAIR WORKS AND PURCHASE OF FURNITURE AT MINOR SEMINARY, SAMBALPUR.

Diocese: Sambalpur | Location: Odisha

Jyoti Bhavan Minor Seminary is the diocesan minor seminary. This seminary is 55 years old the furniture of the house is as old as the seminary. Because of this many of the furniture specially the small cupboard cannot be used to store anything. Some are damaged by white ants, and some have decayed. The purpose of the project is to provide new Almirahs to the seminarians. The aim of the project is to ensure that the seminarians' personal belongings are safe and secure. The appearance of the seminarian's living rooms may be neat and tidy.



FURNISHING THE NEWLY CONSTRUCTED CHURCH AT ASHOKA SIDDAPURA

Diocese: Shimoga | Location: Karnataka

The project is aimed at providing pews (benches with kneelers) and altar chairs to the newly constructed, Mother of God Church at Ashoka Siddapura in Molakalmuru Taluk of Chitradurga District within the diocese of Shimoga.

The people of Ashoka Siddapura are economically extremely poor and socially very backward. There are 20 Catholic families and more than 150 Christu Bhaktas participating in religious services. Ashoka Siddapura is a sub-station of Molakalmuru Mission Centre. Ashoka Siddapura is 27 Kilometers from Molakalmuru. The transportation facility is very poor. Presently there is no Church building in Ashoka Siddapura.





The Mass is celebrated and religious services are held in a small shed which can hardly accommodate about 15 people. Rest of the participants stand outside the shed and participate in the religious services.

The aim of the Project is to equip the newly built Church with Pews (benches with kneelers) and Altar chairs. The main objective is to provide the faithful, especially the elders proper sitting facilities to actively and devoutly participate in the prayer services and Catechesis. Another objective is that because there is proper sitting facilities, more and more people will come to the Church and participate in the Catechesis. This will also add the number of Christu Bhaktas.







30 young leaders, from 10 regions of India, participated and took pledge to become Communio missionaries in rural India, during the 5-day Mission Animation Programme – 'Communio Volunteership', which was organised by Communio in collaboration with CCBI Youth Commission.

The programme was inaugurated on March 19, 2024 at Shanti Sadan, Benaulim, Goa in the presence of Most Rev. Ignatius D'Souza, Chairman of Commission for Youth and Bishop of Bareilly Diocese.

The programme culminated on March 23, 2024, with the celebration of Holy Mass by Cardinal Filipe Neri Ferrão, President of CCBI and Archbishop of Goa and Daman, Chairman of Communio. Bestowing his blessing upon the participants,

His Eminence, led the participants into taking the Communio Pledge and awarded them with participation certificates. In his valedictory remarks, he urged the participants to "Be a Synodal Missionary Leader" and emphasized on the importance of walking alongside others, listening attentively and extending compassion to those in need.

The programme comprised a series of informational, inspirational and motivational talks, by different speakers. Rev. Dr. Stephen Alathara, Deputy Secretary General of CCBI and Director of Communio, gave a detailed insight into the Church in India, CCBI and its Commissions. Rev. Fr. Vignan Das, Associate Director of Communio, gave a descriptive idea about Communio, its pillars, objectives and its accomplishments.















Rev. Fr. Chetan Machado, Executive Secretary, Youth Commission, presented the stories of young missionary Saints in the Church. Rev. Dr. Cyril Victor, Coordinator for CCBI Media Apostolate, and Communio Stakeholders, Ms. Angela Nayak and Ms. Anastasia Pinto explained about how the Media in particular could be used as a tool in mission and for evangelisation.

Rev. Fr.
